I hope you have all had some kind of opportunity to enjoy the summer in one way or another. As most of the local children return to school and as many of us start to return to worshipping in churches, we must never lose sight of those who will not be returning for a variety of reasons. Just as many children will continue to learn at home, or face challenges in accessing education, our worship will continue to try to meet the needs of those who remain at home as well as those joining us in the flesh. Details of both online and church-based services are listed elsewhere in this newsletter. Most Sundays, one of our services will be livestreamed (usually the one I am leading). We must rise to the challenge of meeting to worship with hope and joy where we can, but extending that hope and joy to those who continue to join our worship from home. They are by no means second class worshippers: we have, I hope, much that is positive to learn from our experience of online worship, and about the boundless scope of God's love and grace which transcends the medium through which we worship.

Another change at the moment concerns our ministry with children and young people which, for a number of years, has been very ably co-ordinated by Kate Kennedy. Kate has now relinquished this role to focus her time and talents on other matters, but she will continue to be a member of our church family in this new chapter of her life with us. I am sure you will want to join me in thanking Kate for her amazing work over the years in her role as co-ordinator of our ministry with our younger folk. Her energy, creativity and organisational skills have meant that a huge variety of groups and projects have been offered, and she leaves a fantastic legacy of positive engagement, and nurturing of young people's faith. Thank you Kate for everything you have done in this role, and we look forward to continuing to work and worship alongside you in our parishes in a different guise!

If anyone has any queries relating to children and young people and their important place in the life of our churches, please address these via the Parish Office from now on, rather than via Kate. We will not be rushing into finding a replacement for Kate in her role. Rather, this Autumn term will be a time for reflecting and praying about how we involve and meet the needs of our younger parishioners in the coming years as we take advice from the wider Church. We continue to provide collective worship in a number of local schools and to run our Young Life group for older teenagers, but at a time when family life has changed hugely because of the ongoing pandemic, we need to think carefully about how we support and nurture the faith of our young people and meet these changing needs - so, above all, please pray for discernment and wisdom in our planning.

Physical fellowship is something we all miss. Even when we meet for church services, there is no scope for a chat over coffee afterwards. However, I urge you to keep in touch with one another and keep those church friendships alive - it is as much part of the vibrancy of parish life as the church services. To this end, do consider coming to the Christians Together Harvest service which is on Windmill Hill in Bramham later this month at 1pm on Sunday September 27th. Bring a picnic and something to sit on, and we can at least eat "together" as we worship.
